The average graduation rates for the 13 Oklahoma public universities was 34.1% and the 11 private colleges and universities had an average rate of 42.7%.

Dear Friends,

March 5, 2013

Greetings from Pharr, where I am still here alone, talking to myself. On Wednesday last week, a group of men from Woodcrest Church in Catoosa, OK headed this direction. They picked Brother Mark Cole up in Blanchard on their way down. They came by here on Thursday morning and I accompanied them to the border, helped them find taxis that would take them across the border to the bus station, then I drove their van back and parked it in our front yard.

They arrived in Cuidad Mante that afternoon and Bud picked them up there. Since then they have all been working in Celaya along with two brothers who flew in from Alabama. It was a group from Woodcrest, many of the same men, who built the church there a few years ago. They are working on building an apartment for Pastor Rodrigo Guzman and his wife Felipa above the Sunday School rooms. Brother Rodrigo and Felipa have been living in one of those rooms since they got them built several months ago. This upstairs addition will give them two bedrooms and a living room with a half bath and a lot more privacy. They are going to maintain the kitchen down stairs and use the showers in the large bathrooms that serves the church. That will simplify the plumbing.

Bud called this evening and said that they have the apartment up, the roof on, and the sheetrock was delivered this afternoon. They will be working tomorrow, then the group will head back for the border on Thursday.

On Saturday they went out in small groups and canvased the whole town inviting people to church. Sunday morning there were 51 present, including a couple who come from another small town up in the hills called El Refugio. They brought two visitors with them. Those two elderly men accepted the Lord that morning.

Bud said different ones had gone several times to visit an elderly man there in Celaya who came down with some kind of rare virus a month or so ago. Since then he has been completely helpless, paralyzed. His doctor told the family that it would take him six months to a year to recover use of his arms and legs



although he does have good sensation and feeling in his extremities. On each visit they have always prayed for his health. Bud went back night before last and sat down and visited with him at length, sharing the plan of salvation and he prayed to accept the Lord. So, apart from building the apartment, they have also been busy building the church. Please keep them all in your prayers.

After the Okies leave, Bud will return to Altamira to take the two brothers from Alabama. They will be flying out of Tampico on Friday and Bud should start home early next week.

God bless you richly for your investment in our work in Mexico. We could not do it without you.

FAMILY: After almost three weeks, I feel like my voice and throat are almost back to normal. Thank you for praying for me. Our son, Marc, was sick the second half of last week. Thankfully, he seems to be doing better and was able to go back to school today. This week our kids will be having several tests since it is the end of the grading period. Next Monday our kids will be out of school for Father's Day. Father's Day is actually the 19th, but starting this year some of the holidays will be celebrated on the Monday before the actual date.

WEATHER: This past week we have had a lot of rain. We had a stretch of more than a week that it rained every day and during most of the day several of those days. That is not all that frequent of a thing here in central Spain. Highs for most of this week are supposed to be in the mid-40s, except for Wednesday and Thursday when a cold front pushes through giving us a chance of some snow.

IN THE NEWS: The euro exchange rate has dropped a little to \$1.30. Recently an article came out saying that Spain has moved up to the 4th most competitive country in the world in the area of tourism. The World Economic Forum that published these rankings suggests that tourism could tremendously help out the unemployment problem in Spain. The 17-nation eurozone hit a new record in unemployment with an 11.9 % jobless rate. This compares with Spain's unemployment of 26.9%. The Spanish airline company Iberia has negotiated with a mediator to "let go" only 3,141 employees instead of 3,807.

CHURCH / MINISTRY: Tim Johnson ended up preaching for me the last time I was supposed to preach, so that I would have more time to let my voice recover. Last Sunday, a layman in our church brought the message. This Sunday, March 17, we will be celebrating Bible Day. The Director of Spain's United Bible Society will be presenting their ministry and preaching for us this Sunday in Alpedrete. Next week we will have Field Council meetings along with the Director of Field Operations, Jeff Turnbough. Last week the Alpedrete Church turned in the final papers to be recognized as a legally organized church. Pray that these papers will be processed in a timely and favorable manner. Former General Director Rolla D. Smith Dies

Antioch, TN—Reverend Rolla D. Smith, former general director of Free Will Baptist Foreign Missions, entered Heaven's gates around 1:45 a.m., March 15, 2013. The 92-year-old was hospitalized and diagnosed with pneumonia earlier this month. Brother Smith was trans-



ferred to West Meade Place, a rehab facility, where he continued to decline and died.

Smith had the unique responsibility of serving as general director two times. He was first asked to serve in 1959 and continued until 1962. Following his resignation as general director, the Missouri native was elected to the mission board where he served faithfully from August 1962 until July 1975. During those years, he also pastored churches in Missouri, Georgia, and Tennessee. The board asked him to serve a second stint as general director and Smith spent another 11 years at the helm (1975-1986) of the foreign missions department. "Uncle Rolla," as missionary kids worldwide called him, loved missionary families and was passionate about getting the gospel to the regions beyond.

Reverend Smith leaves behind his wife Helen Ketteman Smith and daughter Beth (Vernon) Whaley. Additional family members are listed in his obituary. In lieu of flowers, donations may be made to International Missions.

40 Days of Prayer and Fasting 2013 Announced

Antioch, TN—International Missions' General Director Clint Morgan has issued a new call to prayer and fasting. "In 2011, as I began my tenure, I greatly sensed an immense need for God's direction and guidance. I asked others to join me and the Mission family in 40 days of prayer and fasting," Morgan recalls. "People responded generously. Many told me how God worked in their lives as a result of this focused time of prayer.

Even more amazing was how we saw God respond! We believe He gave wisdom and direction to International Missions' board and directors. Last year's World Missions Offering exceeded \$1 million—only through God's goodness and grace. Monthly income, though not at record levels, exceeds the previous year. Enthusiastic, highly qualified young people are seeking to serve overseas. God has totally exceeded our expectations, on every level!" The 40 Days of Prayer and Fasting is scheduled to begin Wednesday, March 20 and conclude on April 28-World Missions Sunday. According to Director Morgan, "We want to focus prayer on three areas: missionary and Mission needs, the needs of national pastors and leaders, and the Mission's future strategies concerning fields of work, people groups, and finances."

"I believe fasting and prayer are essential elements of our Christian walk. However, we do not want either one to become ritualistic. For that reason, I was a bit hesitant to ask our Free Will Baptist people to join us in another 40 Days of Prayer," Morgan explains. "But several pastors and laymen have asked if we were going to have another 40 Days this year. Our office staff and some of the missionary force have requested it. I am delighted to press forward with this initiative." Prayer requests will be available via a PDF download on the Mission's website (fwbgo.com), sent out through social media daily, and released via email to inboxes each morning. Blogs that amplify the request of the day will be uploaded to the Mission website most days.

"We trust God will use this 40 Days to remind us of His faithfulness and, as a result of focused prayer and fasting, lead us to rely even more fully on Him," Morgan concluded.

Seminary of the Cross

"The Mexican FWB's are strong and healthy!" says Dr Thomas Marberry, former president of the Seminario de la Cruz in Reynosa, Mexico. The national convention drew several hundred from north, south, east and west Mexcio. Together they praised the Lord and thanked Him for His grace.

The Seminary, however, is in dire need of funds to complete registration (\$1,000 each) of two vehicles donated. The mens' dorm and the couples' dorms are also in need of repair. Antioch, Tennessee—Darren Portell, administrative director of The Hanna Project, asks our people to respond to a humanitarian crisis impacting our brothers and sisters in Pakistan. Recently, a Free Will Baptist brother and leader in the work in Pakistan communicated dire news: "I recently informed you about the dark problem in Lahore Pakistan... The recent incident in Badami Bagh which burned approximately 300 Christians' houses...(the) government was powerless and could do nothing to ensure security and protect non-Muslims from violence committed by Muslim hardliners..."

Fox News and other news outlets indicate hundreds of Christians' homes were destroyed, Bibles burned, and bodies injured during this attack in Pakistan's second-largest city.

Our brother continued with a plea for help: "Today we were with them (in Lahore) and distributed some food. During our visit with them we found that they need clean water, clothes and utensils and bedding. I would like to ask you, can Hanna Project help the victims of Lahore. They are really needy (at) this time; more than 500 families are settled in canvas tents without any bedding. Please pray and see what (the) Lord guide(s) you (to do to help)."

While we are known as a recent addition to the state, we first organized as an auxiliary in the early 1990's. We have always had a vibrant group of ladies. As with many organizations, over time our original focus was diluted and somehow our good intention and efforts took other forms. Our focus became more about what was being done inside the church instead of outside. Although we were still doing important things (baby & wedding showers, organizing church dinners, planning pastor appreciation, sponsoring families at Thanksgiving and Christmas, and having the occassional missionary speaker or mission project) our primary focus had drifted away from its intended purpose.

That is until I attended the Texas State Meeting last year in Henderson. As I sat in the TWAC meeting I was struck by several realities: First, there was a VERY low number of women in attendance. As I looked around I saw faces I recognized, but many were missing. Secondly, and along the same line, I noticed the absence of young women in the group. The last thing that struck me, and maybe the most disturbing of all, was the disappointing report that was given about the status of the state mission project. As I listened to the report and the numbers that were presented, I realized that the TWAC was falling far short of its goal. In fact, the goal from year to year had been lowered, and we were in danger of not reaching this lowered goal.

I left that meeting and immediately upon returning home called my pastor and shared my concern. I admitted my guilt in the role I played in allowing our ladies group to lose sight of our real mission. I also purposed to do my best to change it, starting right then!

I called a special board meeting with our officers and shared my burden with them. We all agreed that we should shift our focus and redirect our efforts. We would stretch ourselves and truly make missions and our missionaries the central focus of what we are about.

By the end of our meeting we had set a goal for the remainder of 2012 of \$500 - not a lot but definitely attainable in a less-than-six-month period of time. We immediately started a Craig's list program where items in the church were listed with all the proceeds going into our mission account. The ladies hosted a game night. We began highlighting missionaries and their efforts on "Mission Emphasis Sunday" the first Sunday of each month. We select different areas of service, state, home, and foreign.

Coming into the new year we will continue to do this, as well as include our Bible colleges and children's home within our denomination. Our people can see their faces, hear their stories, and know how better to pray for them.

With about \$170 in the bank, we planned our first Fifth Sunday Mission Dinner - the first dinner brought in close to \$500! In one fell swoop, we had exceeded our goal! The ladies were excited, our pastor was excited, and the people of the church were stepping up and coming along side us in our efforts. Our final mission project for 2012 was a Christmas bazaar which featured hand-made and homemade items from ladies in our church. We were competing with other craft sales, weather wasn't great, and on and on. We carried the sale over to Sunday, and offered unsold items to the congregation. When it was all said and done, God had again blessed our efforts and we brought in a total of nearly \$1,200! All in all, our ladies with the help of our church members, had raised \$1,800 in only 5 months! Isn't God amazing! In addition to sending money to the State mission project, the extra money allowed us to help the Jars of Clay Church in Monterrey, Mexico offer scholarships for some of their high school students who must pay to attend school. This is a mission church that was previously was pastored by a couple who attend our church.

We feel our church as a whole has been blessed because of the efforts we made in 2012. We have set a new goal of \$2,500. This new year we will try to make sure everyone has a place to serve. In every church there is someone who can organize an event, send cards or letters of encouragement, give monetary gifts, gifts of time or service. I'm expecting God to do great things in and through the lives of the people in our church.

I would like to issue a challenge to each church in our district, and state. Do something...anything! Have a small church with only a few members in your auxiliary? Have a large church with an active ladies group? Either way get busy working and give God an opportunity to show you what He can do! Little is much when God is in it!
